


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Your Fire Department responded to 20 emergency calls in September:

- 10 medical calls
- 2 false alarms
- 1 snake bite
- 1 dumpster fire
- 1 illegal bonfire
- 1 suicide attempt
- 1 skill saw accident
- 1 car accident
- 1 surfing accident
- 1 public assist

We recently were inspected by ISO, the company that determines home insurance rates based on the performance of your Fire Department. After our review, ISO upgraded our fire protection classification from a Class 5 to a Class 4, effective January 1, 2017. If your insurance company uses ISO to set their rates, your fire insurance premium will be lower. Thanks for all the donations that allowed us to purchase state-of-the-art equipment, and thanks to all the firefighters that put in many hours of training to make this possible. More volunteers will be needed if we plan to continue to improve.

Thanks to everyone that came out to support us at our Ladies Auxiliary Fish Fry. These events give the community a chance to tour the fire station and get a close look at all our firefighting vehicles and equipment. As always, our monthly meetings are held at Station 1 and are open to the public. Board meetings are on the 2nd Tuesday at 5:30 p.m. and our training meetings are on the 1st and 3rd Mondays at 6:30 p.m.

The Auxiliary was very pleased with our annual fish fry. 215 plates were served which included fried fish, baked beans, cole slaw, hushpuppies and a drink. A FEW MONARCH WALKS IN NOVEMBER**

Have you ever wanted to learn more about the magnificent migration of the monarch butterfly and their fascinating life cycle? Come join Refuge volunteer Homer Singleton as he leads participants along the Gator Lake Trail searching for this beautiful butterfly. During the walk Homer will introduce you to the butterflies that pass through this area, their habitats and their life cycles. Participants will also be asked to help catch monarch butterflies so that they can receive tags that will allow scientists to track their migration.



The walks will start at Gator Lake trailhead located off Mobile Street. Walks typically last from 2.5 to 3 hours and participants should come prepared to walk over 2 miles, in soft sand, with minimal shade. Water and bug spray are highly suggested. **The walks will be limited to 12 participants; please make reservations by calling 251-540-7720.**

The monarch walks were held at 9:00am, Wednesdays and Fridays, throughout October and will continue the same days and times on November: 2, 4, and 9.

Alert! Membership Policy Changes

At the monthly meeting on October 10, 2016 decisions were made on various aspects of membership. We have policies that have been in place since the early days when we had only a few members, local residents who knew each other. Now our annual membership runs over 400. The following changes were approved at the meeting.

DEATH OF A MEMBER

We will no longer make a memorial donation to our volunteer fire department. We have no way to know of the passing of many and the VFD is no longer struggling for funds as it was in its early days. **We are requesting a family member notify us of a death**, the date and the website where the obit can be found (funeral home or publication). Our Sunshine Chairperson will send a condolence card. Notice of the passing will be made in a new section of the newsletter.

NEWSLETTER DISTRIBUTION

Our policy has been that membership is a family membership, covering all who use the same residence, permanent or seasonal. We have been getting requests to send the newsletter to multiple addresses, email or postal. We often are not informed of changes, especially to email addresses, and it becomes a time-consuming chore to track down the recipient. The new policy will be to send **one** newsletter per membership. That one recipient may then distribute it to whomever s/he chooses. If another family member wishes to receive it directly from FMCA he or she needs to pay for an additional membership; submit a membership form and annual dues of \$15.

Again we urge all to sign up for email receipt of the newsletter. For you who have concerns about privacy, please note that we do not give out our email list and recipients on the Fort Morgan NEWS are shown only as blind copies (not visible to other recipients). The only email address which can be gleaned from an email from FMCA is that of the sender.

Fort Morgan Planning & Zoning Advisory Committee

At the Civic Association meeting on the October 10th, Paul reported that Ken Steiner had resigned as Chair of the committee because of his health problems. We did not have a quorum at the FMCA meeting but needed to replace Ken in order to have a quorum at the scheduled semi-annual committee meeting set for October 19th. Bonnie Lowry and Randy Ulrich had both notified the committee that they would be on vacation on that date. Paul made an executive temporary appointment to the committee of FMCA Vice President Ernie Church pending election of a replacement member with a quorum at the next FMCA meeting.

The only courtesy member of the FMCA Planning & Zoning Advisory Committee present on October 19th was Mayor Robert Craft. There were no requests for rezoning or variances presented. The only business was to elect Chan West as chairperson. Next scheduled meeting is for April 19, 2017.

Unwanted Fort Morgan Resident: Beach Vitex (*Vitex rotundifolia*):



Beach vitex is an invasive species new to the Alabama Gulf Coast and may have been seen recently in the Cabana Beach subdivision. This plant was introduced to the Southeastern United States in the mid-1980s as an ornamental and also for beach stabilization. However, the plant does not provide beach stabilization and negatively impacts sea turtles. It is a deciduous woody vine native to Korea and other western Pacific countries. It has been found in isolated pockets of Perdido Key, Orange Beach, Gulf Shores and Fort Morgan. It can be eradicated. For more information, please visit these sites:

From the By-laws Adopted April 11, 2005

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 Regular (voting) Membership in this association shall be open only to property owners and/or residents in the unincorporated area west of mile 14.7 of the Fort Morgan peninsula.

Section 2 Associate (non-voting) Membership shall be open to residents of areas outside the Fort Morgan Peninsula whose interests coincide with those of the Association including the preservation of the environment and quality of life of the Fort Morgan peninsula.

Section 3 Membership application shall be made by completion of a form provided by the Association and payment of the required dues. Dues for the following year shall be determined at the October general meeting and shall be for the following calendar year January 1st through December 31st.

Section 4 Payment of Regular (voting) Membership dues entitles a member household to one (1) vote. A member household is comprised of Association members living at one physical address. Past year member households paying dues after January 31st and new members joining the Association will have no voting rights until thirty (30) days after payment of dues.

Section 5 Payment of Associate (non-voting) Membership dues entitles the member to attend all member meetings and receive the monthly newsletter.
